



## Re: Indiana Parks on the Air

This is an announcement for a new operating opportunity for Indiana amateurs. Yes, I know, you're probably thinking what do we need with another operating event but hear me out. This is a chance to get out and operate in a state park to have fun while practicing your operating skills. The idea is to operate either from a state park or to contact someone who is at a state park with a chance to earn an award. For those adventuresome enough going to a park a minimum of 4 QSOs will be credit you with a 'Park Activation'. Activating a park or working someone at a state park puts you on your way to earning an Activator or Chaser award. Either way, operating from the comfort of your home or packing a lunch and taking a cooler with cold drinks to operate from a picnic table or camper can be both relaxing and fun. Why not use this as an opportunity to make a lightweight antenna, i.e. a segmented dipole or take your Buddi-pole and make some contacts. For fast setup why not consider an inexpensive pushup pole to support your antenna(s). See <http://www.tmastco.com/> for lightweight masts. This is a great way for a QRP op to get on with minimum effort, a battery, antenna and inexpensive rig and bingo, you're on the air.

The Indiana Parks on the Air will have a dedicated page for posting alerts for upcoming operations and to spot an operation in progress making it easier to get involved as an Activator or Chaser. Additionally, there will be a yearly contest to run concurrent with the Ohio Parks on the Air contest also held in September.
